
Hope plus money – now there's a dynamic duo!


Hop To It! Easter Monday at the Edmonton Valley Zoo

A MESSAGE FROM COUNCILLOR MICHAEL WALTERS

UPDATE ON SEWER ODOURS

As a City, we continue to invest in one of our most critical pieces of infrastructure - our drainage system. This year alone, as part of our Drainage Capacity Implementation Program, \$186 million has been invested in our drainage system. This investment will continue to increase on an annual basis, and by 2025, this investment will reach \$288 million per year. In total, from 2016 to 2025, over \$2 billion will be invested expanding and renewing this critical piece of Infrastructure.

Much of this investment has been, and will continue to be, used for upgrades and renewal to the drainage system throughout Ward 10.

Back in 2013, while door knocking in the area 34 Avenue and 106 Street, residents of Duggan expressed concerns of putrid sewer odors. And following the campaign, my team continued to receive complaints from area residents. As a result, my office worked with drainage operations to extensively investigate the root cause and determine a long-term solution.

Over the past two years, efforts have been made in Duggan to seal manholes and use chemical treatments to flush the sewer system. However, based on continuing reports from area residents, these efforts were unsuccessful.

The long term plan to address the odour issue is as follows:

- Making changes to two drop shafts at 111 Street/29 Avenue and 106 Street/34 Avenue. Construction is planned for 2019-2020.
- Treating odorous compounds at some strategic locations, including pump stations at Blue Quill, Twin Brooks and Blackburne. The implementation will start in 2019.
- Upgrading and modifying the operating mechanism of the Duggan Pump Station located at 105 Street/45 Avenue.
 This will start in 2020.
- If possible, installing one or two vent stacks at 111 Street and 34 Avenue to reduce the trunk sewer air pressure.
 These are planned for 2020.

I take my responsibility to represent you seriously.
