The next General Election will be held on **Monday October 16**, **2017**.

All residents of Edmonton are encouraged to vote in this election!

Voters will elect:

- 1 Mayor
- 1 Councillor for each of the 12 City of Edmonton wards
- 1 Edmonton Catholic School District Trustee for each of the 7 wards
- 1 Edmonton Public School District Trustee for each of the 9 wards

WHO IS RUNNING FOR ELECTION?

Candidates do not become official until Nomination Day: **Monday September 18, 2017** View who has filed Notice of Intent to run for election.



All About Candidate Forums

What are candidate forums?

Candidate forums are a series of public events that provide voters the opportunity to hear from (and ask questions of) all candidates running for mayor and city councillor in the 2017 Edmonton Election.

Who can attend?

Anyone is welcome to attend the candidate forums.

What if I'm not able to attend a candidate forum?

All candidate forums will be webcast live on the Edmonton Elections website (edmonton.ca/election). A recording of the candidate forum will be posted on the Edmonton Elections website in the days following the event.

When are the candidate forums?

All candidate forums are scheduled from Monday, September 25 to Wednesday, October 11, 2017. See page three for the full schedule.

Where do candidate forums occur?

Each forum is held in a different location, but most take place in schools throughout the city and within the applicable ward. See the full schedule on page three for specific location information.





How many candidate forums are there?

Fifteen candidate forums have been scheduled. There are three forums for mayoral candidates and one for each ward for councillor candidates.

What can I expect at a candidate forum?

A moderator will oversee the candidate forums. Each candidate will be given the opportunity to introduce himself/herself and make opening remarks. Next, the moderator will take questions from the audience (and questions asked over social media) and ask the candidates to respond. The candidates will finish with closing remarks. Seating, coffee, tea, and water are available for everyone attending the forum.

What accommodations will be provided at candidate forums?

All candidate forum locations are wheelchair accessible. Real-time captioning will be provided on a projector screen at each candidate forum and an American Sign Language interpreter will be on-site. Candidate forum webcasts will be close captioned and can be watched live or at a later date

Halloween Safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31st approaches. Take some time to review these simple tips and reminders to help ensure your Halloween is a fun and safe night for everyone.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: all regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Stay away from houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers, or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-ortreat within, and establish a firm time to return home.
- Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- Choose bright colored costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing, or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flameresistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic makeup kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes should not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate foot wear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.
