BUS NETWORK REDESIGN

Edmonton's bus routes are changing. The new network focuses on connecting people to places and to each other.

The Bus Network Redesign is the first major action coming out of the <u>Transit Strategy</u>. The new bus network, built with input from thousands of Edmontonians, reflects residents' priorities by delivering a bus service that meets the needs of more people.

SPRING 2018: DEVELOP THE BUS NETWORK

Starting in April 2018, we will start consulting Edmontonians, asking them to help us refine the new bus network by providing their feedback and sharing their local knowledge.

SUMMER/FALL 2018: REFINE THE BUS NETWORK

We will use the information shared by Edmontonians in the first round of engagement to refine the new bus network.

In the fall, we will check back with Edmontonians to share how we incorporated their feedback into the final bus network, and to gather final feedback.

2019: PREPARE THE BUS NETWORK

We will begin preparations to launch the new bus network. Work will include developing educational materials, creating new bus maps and making new bus stop signs among other things.

2020: ROLL OUT THE BUS NETWORK

We anticipate that the new bus network will be implemented In 2020.

CAT MICROCHIP CLINICS



To help increase the number of lost cats that are returned home to their owners, the Animal Care & Control Centre (ACCC) is launching a six-month cat microchipping pilot program. Beginning January 2018, cat licenses will include a microchip. Bring your licensed, crated cat into ACCC for placement of a microchip during one of our monthly Microchip Clinics. These clinics will be held once a month, for six months, on the last Thursday of the month.

If your cat isn't licensed you can purchase it that day. A City of Edmonton cat licence is just \$21 for a fixed animal. Government issued photo ID and proof of ownership is required.

85% of dogs admitted to ACCC are returned to their owner while only 16% of cats make it home. This is due to a lack of ID on cats admitted into the centre.

The EFCL's annual Great Neighbour Race is a family-friendly event and fundraiser that brings communities together. All net proceeds go to the EFCL 100th


Anniversary Project which will build the new Community League Plaza in William Hawrelak Park.


- U10 Girls (Burk) Gold Tier 6


